



The door at the entrance to Fatburger and Ricky's All Day Grill at 3732 Kepler Street is now open to the public. The duo franchise that sees two brands under one roof had its official ribbon cutting on Thursday, November 30, with doors opening for the public on Friday, December 1. Upon entering the main door, visitors can either enter Ricky's door on the left or walk straight

through the door to Fatburger, and both are open to each other on the inside. There is also a drive-thru for Fatburger on the building's left side.

Vijay Kumar and Maitri Patel are the owner-operators at the helm of the restaurants and are excited to get locals and highway visitors in the door. "The Whitecourt community and visitors alike will have two great meal options to choose from. including enjoying a hearty breakfast with family, having a great Fatburger for lunch, dinner, or watching the game at Happy Hour," said Kumar. Patel said both brands focus on family and quality, adding, "it's sure to be a hit with everyone, young and old." Kumar and Patel moved to Whitecourt to take on the new business, and both said they are looking for-



ward to becoming part of the community.

Stacey Hansson, Senior Vice President of Corporate Services and Franchise Relations for FTF Brandz, said selecting Whitecourt was a decision that came from the top. "Our CEO works with a brokerage firm, and they found this site. We always look for good locations in small towns,

especially high-traffic areas. Our CEO determined it was a good location after doing all the research and ensuring it fit our demographic."

Raymond Ho, Vice President, Marketing and Communications for FTF Brandz, explained that the idea to create dual franchise locations popped up during COVID, when pick-up and take-out grew in popularity. He

said people's habits for when and how they eat have changed, leading to a Dual-Branded Single Facility Concept where two brands share the square footage that typically one standalone brand would use. Whitecourt's location is the fourth of its kind, featuring Fatburger and Ricky's. Ho added that their dual restaurants have been exceeding expectations.

John Grieve, VP of

Fatburger Canada, said the combination concept merges the popular parts from each of the stand-alone stores and that together, it creates a warm, welcoming vibe. "When customers walk in, they're going to get a warm feeling and feel invited in with modern, warm décor, and thev'll see the energy of our crew. People have fun when they come in."

For Ho, the legacy



behind both businesses is what sets them apart. "Both of them have a long history and legacy of doing business. Fatburger started in LA in 1952. It's all about the big juicy burgers. I think this is going to be perfect for a lot of people here. Ricky's has been around since 1962 and is a staple for many generations in the communities they are in. Grandparents have gone with their

kids and grandkids."







Canadian economy - same story, different GDP route

A surprising Canadian GDP report this morning. The third quarter fell much more than expected, but the second quarter was revised up sharply. A bit of a GDP rollercoaster, but today's report does not change the storyline that Canada's economy has effectively ground to a halt.

The numbers: Canada's real GDP contracted at an annualized

rate of 1.1% in the third quarter, much weaker than the Bloomberg consensus of a modest increase. Exports, business investment and inventories weighed on







Festival fundraiser brings beauty to the AJMC for a great local cause





The Festival of Trees is now on at the AJMC. The annual event brings Christmassy beauty to the popular local hangout spot's front hall and results in financial support for a fantastic cause, the BGC Whitecourt & District.

For the last five years, the beginning of December meant it was time for beautifully decorated trees to light up the Allan and Jean Millar Centre hallway to help raise necessary funds for the Boys and Girls Club (BGC) Whitecourt and District, and this year is no exception.

Each year, generous local businesses participate by decorating a tree in any way they like and donating it to the cause. Once on display at the AJMC, community members can purchase raffle tickets on any number of trees they wish.

For 2023, eleven trees were decorated and donated. The generous businesses with trees in the raffle are Whitecourt Stationery. Complete Projects, Family Dental Health, White Wall Wood, New Venture Safety Services, Alta Tech Environmental Services, Get Smart Interiors, Whitecap Resources Inc., Allan & Jean Millar Centre, Co-Operators, and 50th Avenue Dental.

Kyria Baranowski, Executive Director of BGC, said seeing all the trees lined up shows how supportive the community is. "Local businesses have donated all of these trees for us to make this event possible. The raffle tickets are \$10 each, and all proceeds go to BGC Whitecourt and District. People can scan the OR cords at the bottom of the tree and enter for their chance to win a tree of their choosing. Each tree has its own QR code," she explained.

For residents wishing to "shop" from home, the BGC Whitecourt and District Facebook page posts the trees and includes a clickable link for ticket purchases. "On December 15. the draw is done, a week and a bit before Christmas. Once we call our winners, they can come to collect a fully decorated Christmas tree. or alternatively, they also have the option to donate it back to us, at which point we will actually find a family in Whitecourt that needs a Christmas tree."

Baranowski said about ten percent of the trees are donated to the community. "In the past, we partnered with Soaring Eagle and Wellspring and worked with some of our own families that use the club. It allows us to give back to the community from this fundraiser too."

When the opportunity arises, Baranowski said it makes the fundraiser that much more special. "It excites me because it is an opportunity to give back, and the winner gets to have that sense of pride in knowing that they are gifting a family with something special for this time of year. We know there are families in the community that don't get to have a typical Christmas, or they don't get to have a tree, so it makes getting to give someone a tree that much more special."

Whether winners keep their tree or

choose to gift it, the fundraiser is a big deal for the BGC Whitecourt and District because it gives them something that can be hard to come by as a non-profit, unrestricted funds. "When we apply for a grant, it typically ends up being restrictive in what we can and can't do with the money. Many grants will fund our programming but won't cover admin behind-the-scenes costs."

She said grants typically don't cover staffing, food, or transportation, which they use to get youth to different events, such as during summer programming. "We feed a lot of kids throughout the day, too. Grants also don't cover things like rent or power, two big costs for us. So, a fundraiser like this that results in unrestricted funds means we can pay our staff, rent, and utilities to ensure that the doors stay open at all times."

Several local businesses have been part of the fun since day one, and Baranowski said she is very grateful to them. "Since we started this fundraiser event in 2018, New Venture has donated yearly, and they always donate one of the most incredible trees. They take great pride in donating a tree to us, and we are so thankful for their continued support."

Family Dental Health, the Allan and Jean Millar Centre, and Whitecourt Stationery have also graciously donated a tree each year for the fundraiser. Baranowski said they put a lot of effort into making magical trees. She also thanked Staples for helping with their printing needs.

As for the location, Baranowski said it couldn't be more perfect. "We love partnering with the Millar Centre because it does get so much foot traffic. It's such a community hub here because many people come, whether for the pool facilities, the gym, or a kid's activity. Having the windows here makes these even more awesome. My favourite part of this fundraiser is driving along Highway 43 in the evening and seeing all the trees lit up through the window. It absolutely glows."

BGC Whitecourt and District sees anywhere from 25 to 35 children a day. This summer was one of their busiest years for summer camp attendance. "We are excited to be getting back up to our numbers from pre-COVID. This summer, we saw 30 to 40 kids daily, which was fantastic."

the Q3 reading, partly offset by stronger housing investment and government spending. The consumer has pulled way back, with spending flat for the second straight quarter. In contrast, second quarter GDP expanded at an annual clip of 1.4%, revised up from -0.2% previously.

In summary, a similar landing spot, but a different route. We can hold off on the 'technical recession' talk (for now), as the economy did not register two straight quarterly declines (see "what is a recession anyway"). The contrast with our southern neighbour is stark, where U.S. third quarter real GDP ran very hot at 5.2% (annualized) following a 2.1% gain in O2.

Implications? Not the outcome many were expecting, but the main

story is the same. The Canadian economy has cooled dramatically under the weight of higher interest rates, and we expect the Bank of Canada to hold again next month. Tomorrow's jobs report is the last big release before the Bank's December 6 decision.

Closer to home, we don't get a provincial breakdown, but the monthly numbers tell about industries more relevant to Alberta. In the oil sands, GDP edged down slightly (-0.1%) in September, while conventional oil and gas slipped 3.6% with Statistics Canada citing maintenance work on an oil platform off the Atlantic coast. Advance estimates suggest that oil and gas activity picked up in October, contributing to a 0.2% improvement in Canada's overall GDP to kick off the final quarter of the year.



Whitecourt Town Council updates

Whitecourt is making it easier for community members to apply for a building permit. Starting January 1, 2024, Whitecourt will work directly with Safety Codes Agencies to create "one-stop shop" for development and building permits. The change will create a single point of contact for applications, and a more coordinated approach to the permitting process. This move has been made as part of Whitecourt's commitment to reduce red tape. Further information on the new process will be posted on our website for the January launch.

Whitecourt provided support to Woodlands County for its grant application to fund improvements at the Whitecourt Airport. The County will be applying to the Community Airport Program for runway paving and electrical rehabilitation.

Whitecourt has granted approval to the Soaring Eagle Support Society for use of the Town fire pit on February 24, 2024 for its "Coldest Night of the Year" event.

Councillor Chauvet will serve as Deputy Mayor from January 1 to March 31, 2024.
